Our ITT Programme Leads to:

- Qualified Teacher Status (QTS) which allows you to take up a teaching post in England, teaching any age group
- Post Graduate Certificate in Education (PGCE)
- The PGCE gives you 60 M Level credits which can be put towards a Master's Qualification
- Teachers are in demand – and our employment rates are excellent. Salaries start at £32,916 (outside of London) and £40,317 (London).

Where will my placement school be?

You will complete your training in 2 carefully selected, contrasting schools. We take your location and travel time into consideration, and your well-being is prioritised.

- For our primary 5-11 route, you will have placements in KS1 and KS2.
- For early primary, you will have placements in nursery, reception and KS1.
- For primary with SEND, you will have placements in KS1, KS2 and a SEND provision.

In addition to your placement schools, you will get the following enrichment opportunities:

- KS3 and EYFS placements
- Special Provision (SEND) visit
- English as an Additional Language (EAL) visit
- Employability day
- Intensive training and practice weeks

Our QTS Curriculum:

- Exceeds the core curriculum framework and is based on current and seminal research.
- Follows a model of Learn (in training), Explore (with mentors), Apply (in the classroom).
- Has 3 distinct curriculum phases: Introductory (Beginning to Teach), Developmental (Understanding Learning) and Consolidation (Refining Practice).
- Builds subject knowledge through Subject Enhancement Days led by subject experts.
- Includes 20 days of Intensive Training and Practice (ITaP).

When will I first start teaching?

You join your Placement School on the first day of term and you meet fellow trainees, colleagues and the department before pupils arrive.

There is a progressive teaching timetable across the year:

- You start with observations and TA support (early September).
- You begin to plan collaboratively with your mentor, teach sections and then full lessons, building initially to 4/5 lessons a week by October half-term (with a mentor there to support you).
- You meet weekly as a SCITT cohort to develop practice and understand theory at our training centres in Sale or Altrincham, or occasionally in other locations.

The PGCE Programme

Alongside your QTS training, you will receive 8 days of PGCE training – 3 days in central Manchester face to face, and 5 days online.

We are proud to be partnered with the University of Derby which is listed in the Top 20 Universities for Teaching Quality and Student Satisfaction (Times, Sunday Times and the Complete Good University Guide 2024). Their PGCE has been ranked as outstanding by Ofsted.



You will have access to all university resources (online library/student discount cards/counselling support) plus a dedicated personal tutor.

There will be 3 assignments to pass in order to qualify, and the PGCE qualification is worth 60 masters credits.

How will I be assessed?

We prioritise your well-being and workload – and only ask you to do things that add impact and value. You will be assessed through:

- Weekly supportive mentor meetings to discuss your training, development and key areas for focus.
- A termly collaborative progress review visit from your phase lead.
- An interim report and summative report each placement from your mentor.
- 3 assignments to write across the year for your PGCE.

Entry requirements

- A degree awarded by a UK university classified as 2.2 or higher. (Degrees from abroad need to be verified as equivalent by an ENIC [Statement of Comparability](#)).
- At least 3 GCSEs grade A*-C /level 4 (or better) to include English Language, Mathematics, and a Science.
- We will accept equivalency qualifications for your GCSEs.
- We encourage you to gain school experience with us before your application/programme begins .

Fees & Funding

- School-centred training course fees for QTS with PGCE are £9,790. (For QTS only, fees are £7,970).

Tuition fee and maintenance loans are available through Student Finance England. Refer to Student Finance England to see if you are eligible: <https://www.gov.uk/student-finance-calculator>

How to apply?

- You apply through the Department for Education website <https://www.apply-for-teacher-training.education.gov.uk/candidate> (Bright Futures SCITT code is G65).
- Prepare a personal statement in your own words, conveying your passion, suitability and experience (statements generated by AI will not be considered).
- Source 2 referees – ideally academic and professional.
